Retired priests of the Diocese of Marquette receive health and automobile insurance and a monthly pension from the St. Joseph Association, the diocesan priest retirement fund. Diocesan priests live independently during their retirement, and they use their pension for basic needs, such as food, housing and transportation. Parish assessments, plus growth in the St. Joseph Association, have fallen short of what is needed to provide necessary benefits to our retired priests.

All parishes and missions in the Diocese of Marquette will participate in a special collection on September 5/6<sup>th</sup> to help "bridge the gap." It is essential that we ensure adequate retirement and health coverage in the years ahead for our priests, especially in these uncertain times.

Diocesan Priest Retirement Collection

September 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>, 2020

- **What is the St. Joseph Association (SJA)?**

The SJA is our diocesan priest retirement fund. The SJA Board of Directors—made up of Bishop Doerfler, lay representation, and a mix of elected active and senior priests—manages and administers the pension fund for diocesan priests. The SJA Board has provided important services over the years, such as qualifying the plan under law to ensure assets are protected and regularly monitoring fund performance and benefits disbursements.

- **Why is this collection needed?**

1. Proceeds from this collection provide a critical “boost” to the SJA’s invested assets. This ensures that the SJA is able to meet its future obligations to administer pension and benefit payments to our retired priests.
2. The collection increases awareness about the SJA. Every aspect of the life and ministry of a priest is a gift from God. Our priests dedicate their lives to building up our Church. It is with tremendous gratitude that we offer our thanks and support for their service on Good Shepherd Sunday.
3. Our priests are living longer and drawing a pension for a longer period of time than their predecessors.
4. Stock market returns have not always met plan expectations.
5. Annual pension increases have not kept up with inflation.
6. Health care costs have risen dramatically.

- **How has the increase in priest retirement age and the current economic climate affected the SJA?**

The increase in retirement age from 65 to 70 years had a positive effect on the fund’s liability, but this was offset by the decline in the stock market in 2008 and continued market volatility in the years following.

- **What are the benefits of holding the Diocesan Priest Retirement Collection?**

1. The SJA inches closer to its goal of becoming fully funded, guaranteeing adequate retirement and health coverage for our retired priests.
2. Parishes are currently assessed an annual amount for each priest serving at the parish. Parish assessments are expected to decrease over time as the retirement fund grows closer to its goal of being fully funded.

- **Is this different from the annual collection for retired religious?**

Yes! The collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious supports retired priests, brothers, and sisters of religious orders and institutes across America – **not** diocesan priests. This diocesan collection directly benefits our senior (retired) priests in the Diocese of Marquette.

- **How can I give?**

Make checks payable to your parish and use either the special collection envelope for the “Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund” (found in your regular envelope packet) or mark a blank envelope for the benefit of the “Good Shepherd Sunday Collection” and drop it in the collection basket on the weekend of September 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
